Wave pulls the Hat Trick, then Cincy pulls one out of the hat. Wave goes 3-1 on the week, 9 game streak comes to a halt, and Joe Holland hitting streak stops at 18.

Wave tries for the sweep, but loses to Cincy 12-4.

Cincinnati, losers of the first 2 games of the series, put on another hitting display, and after opening up a 4-0 lead in the 1st, never looked back. Starter Cory Hahn gave up 11 runs, 7 earned, in 4 innings, taking the loss. Ted Reedy made his first appearance of the season, pitching the 9th inning. Joey Charron and Ryan Martin also pitched in relief.

For the offense, Scotty Madden hit his 1st homer of the season, and Tommy Manzella drove in 2 runs. In all, the Wave was held to just 6 hits on the day.

Wave continues roll, takes 9th in a row, defeat Cincy 10-1.

J.R. Crowel pitched 5 solid innings, allowing no runs on 7 hits, while striking out 6. Matt Goebel and Tyler Kimmons finished up the game by pitching 3 and 1 innings, respectively.

The offense had a good day at the office, as Nathan Southard went 3-4 with 3 rbi. Other multiple hit players were Brian Bormaster, 3-5, 2 runs, and Greg Dini, 2-5, 1 run 1 rbi.

Joe Holland's 18 game hitting streak came to an end, as he was 0-5 at the plate. Congratulations to Joe Holland, who by the way, is still hitting .344 on the season (as of Sunday).

Wave opens the weekend with the win, 10-5 over Cincinnati.

Billy Mohl battled for 6 innings, giving up 5 runs, only 3 earned, and walked away with the victory. Daniel Latham had yet another impressive outing, going 3 innings, giving up no runs, and yielding only 2 hits.

For the offense, Mr. Hit Streak, Joe Holland, had a perfect night at the plate, going 4-4, with a walk. He also drove in 2 runs, and scored 3 runs. Wes Swackhammer was the only other multiple hit player, as he went 2-3, with a run scored. Nathan Southard and Matt Barket each drove in 2 runs on the night.
